WHAT'S NEW IN 2025





THE FRENCH ALPS REACH NEW HEIGHTS!

On the occasion of the 142th session of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), on Monday 22 July 2024, in Paris, the IOC attributed the staging of the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games 2030 to the French Alps. The IOC members' vote in favour of the French Alps crowns a major piece of team work; it can be viewed as a collective success and a mark of confidence honouring France. The Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games 2030 will be sober, sustainable, inclusive... and largely delivered by the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and Southern French regions. They will contribute to defining the model for future Winter Olympics and Paralympics. France has hosted three editions of the Winter Olympics, the very first one, in Chamonix in 1924, then those in Grenoble in 1968 and Albertville in 1992, as well as hosting the summer Olympics three times, including in **Paris in 2024!**

The Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games 2030 will be organized around four geographical clusters:

- Haute-Savoie Cluster: biathlon (Olympic and Paralympic); and cross-country skiing (Olympic and Paralympic);
- Savoie Cluster: downhill skiing (Olympic and Paralympic); ski-jumping; Nordic combined; bobsleigh; skeleton; and luge;
- Brianconnais Cluster: freestyle skiing (Olympic and Paralympic); snow-board cross (Olympic), para banked slalom;
- Nice-Côte d'Azur Cluster: ice hockey (Olympic and Paralympic), figure skating, short track speed skating, curling (Olympic and Paralympic); and ski and snowboard cross (Olympic).

Of note: 95% of the sites planned for use in the Winter Olympics 2030 already exist, many from the Albertville 92 Games - a major asset to ensure environmentally friendly Olympics!

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





OUR MAJOR VALLEY LIFTS

Our major valley lifts offer efficient alternatives to the tricky roads up to our ski resorts. Rather like aerial metro lines, they connect villages rapidly, bringing them closer together, allowing easy access from the valley bottoms to the ski resorts above. They provide a great solution to the problems caused by too many vehicles coming up to our ski resorts, as well as encouraging people to arrive by train. They offer a comfortable, safe way to access our mountains while helping tackle environmental issues.

Among our best-known major ski lifts are: L'Eau d'Olle Express, its gondola linking Allemond to Oz-en-Oisans to then access L'Alpe d'Huez's ski area; L'Alpe Express, connecting the village of Huez to L'Alpe d'Huez; the Venosc gondola to Les Deux-Alpes; the cable car linking Bourg-Saint-Maurice to Les Arcs; the connection between Orelle and Val Thorens; and the line between Brides-les-Bains and Méribel.

NEW, HIGHLY UNUSUAL TRANSPORT SOLUTIONS `AT SAINT-GERVAIS-MONT-BLANC!



Saint-Gervais Mont-Blanc has recently inaugurated two major new facilities that will greatly improve transport via public transport in the area, respecting the environment: l'Ascenseur des Thermes; and Le Valléen.

L'Ascenseur des Thermes is a ground-breaking project, unique in France. It operates on energy generated from waste water. It enables users to be transported from Le Fayet's thermal spa gardens up to the centre of Saint-Gervais in sustainable fashion, for free and fast! It can carry a maximum of 16 people at a time. Le Valléen

This is a new gondola linking Le Fayet train station to the centre of Saint-Gervais, making access to Le Bettex ski resort so much easier (via the further L'Alpin facility). The Flocon Vert scheme has been developed by the association Mountain Riders both to support ski areas in increasing sustainable development initiatives and to enable those who care about the mountains to see clearly which destinations are acting responsibly. Now, 29 mountain destinations in Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes have received accreditation for their positive actions. The Flocon Vert scheme represents a new way of considering tourism and local life in the mountains, focusing on sustainable values.



A HIGHLY UNUSUAL ACTIVITY: ARCHI SKI

Where architecture meets skiing, as you head out to explore Les Arcs. Enjoy a mix of skiing and culture, guided around by an accredited tour guide and a ski instructor. These archi ski tours enable the curious-minded to live an adventure that goes far beyond an ordinary descent of the slopes. Every bend produces surprises, providing fleeting glimpses of extraordinary facades in unique settings. Our mountains are living spaces that, as well as delighting visitors, are also areas where agricultural and local business activities continue day-to-day and where fragile natural zones need protecting. Many initiatives have been put in place and need promoting, as they underpin the transformations our partners in the mountains are bringing about.

PASTO KEZAKO. WHAT'S THAT?

MAP PATOU - an interactive map to locate herds protected by specialist guard dogs.

As wolves have once again become predators (among others) in our mountains, today, guard dogs provide one of the most efficient ways to protect the herds. More and more of these dogs are being used, an estimated 7,000 to 8,000 now dotted around the Alps. Their presence raises a number of questions and apprehensions from visitors practising outdoor activities in our ranges. The aim of Map Patou is to inform users of the location of protected herds, at the same time making people aware of how to act if they encounter a guard dog.

Created around environmentally friendly projects, they put to the fore natural assets and local know-how. Our region also boasts two national parks, covering the Vanoise and Écrins Ranges, dedicated to protecting and promoting both their natural and cultural heritage. These areas encourage visitors to explore and to get away from busy daily life, contributing greatly to our region's image and identity.

ON YOUR E-BIKE TO EXPLORE HERITAGE AND CRAFT WITH CARTUSIANA



Today, the area attracts many geologists as an excellent site for research. In fact, two out of nine world-rated geological references in France are located here. A third, close to Montbrun-les-Bains, is in the process of being recognized. In 2024, the first two were officially celebrated by the laying of a clou d'or (or golden nail). Our region boasts some 30+ areas dedicated to trail running.



Some 22 million French people go cycling during their holidays, making cycling tourism the biggest type of trekking in the country,

Cycling tourism generates some €4.2 billion a year in economic activity - a cycling tourist is estimated to spend €68 per day, as against €55 for a classic tourist.

The Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region lends itself so well to cycling adventures, from the Auvergne's volcanoes out west to the highest Alps in the east, so get on your bike, with family, among friends, on your own, or as part of a team!

A REGION FOR CYCLING COMPETITIONS

Ours is a great region to explore by bike, what with the many cycle routes crisscrossing it, but it's also a major region for cycling competitions, for example hosting the Tour de l'Ain and the Critérium du Dauphiné, as well as many stages on the Tour de France, not to mention further cycle races. New talent is nurtured in the region, with great cyclists developing here, such as Romain Bardet from Brioude, Rémi Cavagna from Clermont-Ferrand, or the famed Julian Alaphilippe.

Road bikes, mountain bikes, gravel bikes, electric bikes... bike trips, major cycling treks, mountain passes by bike... find out about all the cycle routes and cycling circuits through our region's 12 counties, or départements.

More than a simple website, this is a treasure trove of cycling ideas and includes GPS tracks, descriptions, tourist resources and practical information of all kinds. For each cycle trail featured, using this website, you'll find it so much easier to set off by bike.

The website is geared towards regular or occasional users looking for ideas for cycling outings within a close radius of where they're staying, but also towards seasoned cyclists, with information covering the most iconic cycle routes crossing Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes. So, you can find out all about tackling our mythical mountain passes that feature large in the Tour de France, or then major bike trekking routes such as ViaRhôna or the Grande Traversée du Massif Central

To date, some 700 cycle trails are covered. For each, find details on points of interest on or near the cycle path: bike rental companies; sites to visit; places to swim; cultural and natural heritage; local producers...

The gravel bike version avoids this route's most technically demanding stretches, providing a well-adapted option. So, set out confidently on this discovery tour of the Massif Central by gravel bike, taking in the Morvan's mountains and lakes, and the Auvergne's volcanoes. DES P'TITES ROUTES DU SOLEIL®

There's the Route des Grandes Alpes Gravel linking Thonon-les-Bains to Nice via 850km through our highest Alps, then there's the parallel P'tites Routes du Soleil®, sticking to the lower Alpine foothills, the Chablais, Chartreuse, Vercors, Diois and Baronnies Ranges, great for gravel bikes.

OUR GREENWAYS (VOIES VERTES)

In Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes, the Region is backing cycling! Covering local as well as large-scale projects such as ViaRhôna or the Via Allier, our Region has, since 2016, invested €45 million to support the creation of greenways. Now, almost 500km of these véloroutes are up and running, for the benefit of tourists and locals alike. From now up to 2028, the Region is continuing to develop further stretches, with the aim of creating some 1,000km of such cycling infrastructure, for a dedicated budget of €130 million. Several new greenways have already been identified for development, notably the Via 5 Lacs. (Source Région Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes)

LA BELLE VIA

Meandering across the counties, or départements, of Haute-Savoie, Savoie, Isère and Drôme on its 280km journey, La Belle Via offers an alternative to ViaRhôna. This cycle route is accessible to all levels, crossing Alpine Valleys with scarcely any shifts in altitude and running beside major lakes such as Lac du Bourget and Lac d'Annecy. La Belle Via is great for a cycling trek mixing nature, culture and the culinary. Mont Blanc features large, but the smaller ranges of the Jura, the Bauges, the Chartreuse, the Belledonne and the Vercors also provide magnificent backdrops.

LA DOLCE VIA

This gentle cycle route leads you along 90km, through some of the Ardèche's finest unspoilt natural areas. Tranquillity reigns along La Dolce Via. With its connection to ViaRhôna, from there, you can even cycle down as far as the Med. You can tackle La Dolce Via by gravel bike as well as by mountain bike and most of the way, you're separated from motorized traffic, plus shifts in altitude never exceed 3%. Fans of cycling tourism will be in their element!

Along La Dolce Via: the Lodges de Praly at Les Ollières stand just 50m from the cycle route! They make a perfect starting point for exploring the Eyrieux Valley, by bike, or then hiking. Choose from four lodges: an unusual Chalet at the top of the grounds; l'Escale, in the midst of the garden; le Pavillon, shaded by an umbrella pine; and l'Appart, in the main house. This is a welcoming address in the heart of the Parc Naturel Régional des Monts d'Ardèche. www.leslodgesdepraly.fr

HAUTE-LOIRE, BOASTING NEW CYCLING TRAILS

For keen cyclists, the county of Haute-Loire is packed with beautiful winding roads and passes through the Velay area's volcanoes. There are cycle paths suitable for families, or ones involving major shifts in altitude. Now, 43 new cycling circuits are available to try out via the app Rando(s) Haute-Loire, helping the département gain recognition as an Espace Cyclosport, an accreditation awarded by the Fédération Française de Cyclisme. www.myhauteloire.fr

For organized cycling trips combining nature and heritage
Tackle the southern part of the Via Allier, the Auvergne's main cycle
route, on electric bike. Starting from the town of Brioude, explore

Chanteuges... Make the most of this route beside the Allier River,
known as one of the last rivers for wild salmon in Europe, full of

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA **TRAILS**

Several Santiago de Compostela pilgrimage routes cross the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region.

Among exceptional treks through our region, the Compostela routes are great to tackle, allowing walkers to follow iconic pilgrimage paths used since the Middle Ages. Whether embarking on the journey of a lifetime, enjoying the simple pleasure of walking, or for a sporting challenge, these routes take you through exhilarating landscapes dotted with UNESCO World Heritage Site monuments. The nodal point, Le Puy-en-Velay, is European capital of the Santiago de Compostela pilgrimage routes; you might use it for the start or end of your hike.





PRESS TRIP IDEA

For a taste of pilgrimage
Tackle a portion of the Santiago de Compostela pilgrimage trail along the GR®65 national hiking path west of Le Puy-en-Velay, starting from Saint-Jeures. This 21 km-long stage leads you through typical volcanic tops (sucs) in the Haute-Loire, taking in iconic sites, artistic creations

A gentler, 19km stage takes you on to Le Puy-en-Velay, European capital of Santiago de Compostela trails, several meeting here.

ZOOMING IN ON THE VIA GEBENNENSIS

(Voie de Genève or Geneva Way)

From Lake Geneva, the route follows the Rhône's course, crossing a part of Haute-Savoie with great views over Geneva and the Jura Mountains. After Yenne, the trail enters the county of Isère, where historic villages abound. The Rhône allows itself its last meanders as the mountains of the Parc Naturel Régional du Pilat come into view. Then the vineyards and orchards give way to the plateaux and pastures of the Vivarais region. Volcanic tops and forests mark your entrance into the Velay area, before you reach the European capital of the Santiago de Compostela trails. (GR® 65: Genève, Le Puy-en-Velay)

CLUNY AND LYON ROUTES TO LE PUY-EN-VELAY

Starting from Cluny in Burgundy, the trail guides you over the Beaujolais hills and meanders through the Côtes Roannaises vineyards before reaching the Monts du Forez. Or, starting from the foot of Fourvière Basilica in Lyon, the alternative trail leads you across the Monts du Lyonnais, then those of the Forez. At Montbrison, these two alternative routes meet. That's because the GR®765 proposes a choice to hikers: Cluny to Le Puy-en-Velay via a more westerly route;

or Lyon to Le Puy-en-Velay via a more easterly one.

L'OREILLE DU PÈLERIN

This gîte d'étape is a hikers' hostel in the county of Rhône, at Saint-Jacques-des-Arrêts, a village perfectly located at the point where the Santiago de Compostela trail and the St Francis of Assisi trail intersect. Pilgrims and other hikers sleep in charming wooden chalets. (69) www.oreillepelerin.fr

FENÊTRES SUR LE PAYSAGE

This is an artistic trail along the Santiago de Compostela routes, begun back in 2016. The project continues to evolve, with the creation of a series of art works that double as refuges, featuring temporary artistic events and pieces that add to the landscapes you cross.

Along the Geneva Way, two such art-refuges have

The art-refuge entitled Suchaillou welcomes hikers for a night, providing them with an exceptional artistic experience in the middle of nature. It consists of a troglodytic shelter exploiting local geology in a landscape of rounded volcanic tops (sucs). (43) www.derrierelehublot.fr

At Andilly in Haute-Savoie, Paul-Emmanuel Loiret's art-refuge is a shelter for pilgrims and hikers perched on Mont Sion. As to artist Alberto Ruce, he's created a diptych on the village walls, its story focusing on what's passed down the generations and what the Santiago trail evokes for him. (74)

In the Parc Naturel Régional du Pilat, two artists, Eric Tabuchi & Nelly Monnier, have designed a triptych of works in the Miracle! collection along the GR®65 hiking trail, in the parishes of Malleval, Bourg-Argental and Saint-Sauveur-en-Rue. Their creations incite hikers to stop to discover the Pilat's landscapes.

At Saint-Julien-Chapteuil in Haute-Loire, with Le Gratte-Cieux, entry phone buzzers for a 30-storey block set off recordings about the Maisons d'Assemblées (village religious schools) in the Velay, connecting past, present and future. (43) www.derrierelehublot.fr
